

## **EDITORIAL**



For my third year at the helm of the Festival International de Colmar, I wanted to offer a lively programme in which classical music maintains a dialogue with our times and remains open to influences from other repertoires. From the baroque era to the contemporary, classical music has always been nourished by exotic encounters and new experiences.

With this in mind, I've come up with a programme in which a wide variety of works will be performed side by side, each adding a new hue: a string quartet, for example, may precede sounds from jazz or Eastern European folklore, and baroque music may take unexpected paths and take on unexpected colours. This diversity is not simply an effect of programming, but a conviction: music is built on exchange, exploration and transmission.

Once again this year, world-renowned performers such as Yuja Wang, Gautier Capuçon and Viktoria Mullova will honour us with their presence. Alongside them will be emerging talents such as Alexander Malofeev and Tim Mead, creating a link between tradition and daring, but always of the highest calibre.

It's a state of mind that guides the initiatives we continue to develop around the concerts. Once again, the Colmar Symphonic Mob© will perfectly embody this desire to make the orchestra accessible to all, bringing amateurs and professionals together in the same energy. The Master Classes, which are open to the public, will once again enable young musicians to come into contact with the greatest and allow everyone to observe the mechanisms of classical music teaching. Finally, the pricing policy for the younger generation remains a key priority. Each 8.30pm concert will continue to be introduced by a mediation session.

Let's continue this musical adventure together and make Colmar, more than ever, a place where music is listened to, shared and reinvented.

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

A tribute to the great Russian Romantic music, the programme proposed to us here by **Alain Altinoglu** is a true journey to the heart of the Slavic soul.

Scheherazade is one of **Rimsky-Korsakov**'s most dazzling pieces. Halfway between a classical symphony and a symphonic poem, it unfolds like a true musical tale, virtuoso and colourful.

Also a virtuoso, and to what degree, **Rachmaninoff's** Second Piano Concerto was an opportunity for the composer to emerge from a terrible depression, which had prevented him for too many months from writing a single page of music.

This is an opportunity to welcome back **Alexander Malofeev** who, at just 23, is one of the most prodigious pianists of the younger generation. He gained his international reputation at the 8<sup>e</sup> International Tchaikovsky Competition for Young Musicians held in Moscow in 2014. Thanks to his outstanding performance, he won the **I**<sup>er</sup> **Prize and the Gold Medal**.

Maestro Riccardo Chailly had this to say about the pianist: 'I first heard Malofeev when Valery Gergiev played with him at the Teatro alla Scala three years ago. He was only 14, and I was impressed by his talent. For he is not just a child prodigy: he is very young, but already possesses a depth and technical, musical and mnemonic abilities that make him an excellent interpreter of Rachmaninov's 3° Concerto, which poses problems for many pianists around the world.' A few violin notes are enough to take you back to your childhood. When you hear Peter's main theme, it's hard not to imagine the disobedient child romping through the forest.



What a pleasure to rediscover the highly original *Concerto for Trumpet and Orchestra in E-flat Major*, which **Haydn** wrote for the brand new valve trumpet, performed by one of today's great trumpet players: Sebastian Berner, principal trumpet soloist of the HR-Sinfonieorchester Frankfurt and the latest winner of the prestigious Maurice André Competition!

The incredible Variations on a *Theme by Haydn* weave the link between the first Viennese School and **Brahms**, whose *Symphony No. 3* is one of the masterpieces. Made popular in the 20th century by the reinterpretation of one of its themes by a wide variety of artists, from Sinatra to Gainsbourg, not forgetting Litvak's ineffable Aimez-vous Brahms based on the novel by Françoise Sagan, it even managed to silence the composer's most fierce detractors at its premiere!


The works that have inspired him can be discovered on the festival's website and in the museum's halls through specific labels.

The Festival house houses a **daytime ticket office** and **information point**, as well as the **Festival's daily programme**, **Kiosque!**

**'Kiosque!', a daily programme broadcast** during the festival, in public at the Koïfhus, and live-streamed (on Facebook, LinkedIn and YouTube), is back for the 2025 edition. Interviews with artists by Olivier Erouart - a well-known voice in classical music in Alsace - and presentations of young talent, as well as discussions with those who make, accompany or support the festival. **Alain Altinoglu**, a **renowned French conductor**, has been Music Director of the Théâtre Royal de la Monnaie in Brussels since 2015 and of the hr-Sinfonieorchester Frankfurt since 2021.

In 2023, he will become the face of the **Festival International de Colmar** as Artistic Director, bringing a personal and accessible touch to the event.

**Appreciated for his closeness to the audience**, he combines musical excellence with simplicity. He conducts some of the world's greatest orchestras, and has distinguished himself in leading opera houses. His acclaimed recordings and his teaching at the Paris Conservatoire confirm his influence in the music world.



## THE FESTIVAL ASSOCIATION

The 'Festival International de Colmar' is a completely independent association under local law (1908 Act), but operates in synergy with the Colmar and Region Tourist Office to pool skills.

The development policy and direction of the Festival are defined by the Board of Directors and the General Meeting of the association.

The Festival has been able to grow thanks to the exemplary involvement of private and public companies. Sponsors, patrons, public and private partners have believed in this event, seeing it as a means of communication that meets their requirements in terms of 'image return'.

## **Prestigious concert venues**

In three series and three places

Colmar, a city of history and art, is an ideal setting for the Festival. Each year, three series of concerts take place in three major historic places with different capacities to ensure atmosphere, emotion and proximity with the musicians.



## The 12:30 p.m.

### Koïfhus (14-15th century) Capacity of 200 places

Completed around 1480, this building symbolized the political and economic power of Colmar. A former customs center closely linked to the wine economy of the Wine Capital of Alsace, the Koïfhus is today one of the beating hearts of Colmar life, whatever the season, which its recent masterful renovation has not made what to accentuate.

## The 6:00 p.m.

### Municipal Theater of Colmar (1849) Capacity of 500 seats

The first theater built in Haute-Alsace, the Colmar municipal theater opened in 1849. The architect Louis-Michel Boltz designed an elegant, classic "French-style" exterior facade overlooking Rue Kléber. The room is designed in the tradition of "Italian-style" theaters, comprising three galleries. The interior decoration is due to the Parisian artist Boulangé, who also created the large ceiling painting in 1848.





# The Prestige Concerts at 8:30 p.m.

## Saint Matthieu Church (14th century) Capacity of 750 places

Recently restored, this former Franciscan church, a remarkable example of the Gothic architecture of the mendicant orders, has very beautiful acoustics. The Festival thus offers very high quality concerts given in prestigious heritage sites.
